This information is particularly important for orthopaedic surgeons who are involved in Foundation Model or employed arrangements, but also of interest to surgeons in private practice.

COA has purchased the 2021 Compensation and Productivity Data from the American Medical Group Association (AMGA) – who surveys large entities and complies this data annually - national data, as noted in their 5-year trend charts, and the west region data, which includes California. The reports include the following data points – median compensation, median work RVUs, compensation per work RVUs, median net collections, and median compensation to net collections for the following orthopaedic areas - Orthopedic Surgery, Orthopedic Sports Medicine, Orthopedic Joint Replacement and Orthopedic – Trauma. If there is another orthopaedic subspecialty area that you would like the data, we will see if AMGA has produced a 5-year trend report for that orthopaedic sub-specialty area and provide it to you if it is available.

Under our license agreement with AMGA, we are able to make the information available only to COA members upon request.
