## **Workers' Compensation Alert**

California Orthopaedic Association From Nov. 13: Good News.

The Division of Workers' Compensation has released an updated version of proposed changes to the Medical-Legal Fee Schedule. The Division heard the concerns of physicians and moved back more to implementing the agreement reached by stakeholders (including COA) which is what COA had urged the Division to do.

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# **2020 Coding Policy Updates Include Shoulder Revision**

**From Jan. 20:** The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) recently released the National Correct Coding Initiative (NCCI) Policy Manual for Medicare Services for 2020. Specifically, the Arthroscopy section within Musculoskeletal System (Chapter IV) has been revised regarding the shoulder. Previous policy stated that CMS considers the shoulder to be a single anatomic structure. For 2020, this line has been deleted from the manual. While code pair edits remain for some shoulder arthroscopy procedures (eg, 29827, 29828) with limited debridement (eg, 29822), the AAOS applauds this change which it has advocated for since 2010 in conjunction with the following groups: the American Shoulder and Elbow Surgeons, the Arthroscopy Association of North America—both members of the Orthopaedic PAC Advisor's Circle—and the American Orthopaedic Society for Sports Medicine.

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## **CMS Announces Historic Changes to Physician Self-Referral** Regulations

Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services

**From Nov. 25:** The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) finalized changes to outdated federal regulations that have burdened health care providers with added administrative costs and impeded the health care system's move toward value-based reimbursement. The Physician Self-Referral Law, also known as the "Stark Law," generally prohibits a physician from making referrals to an entity for certain healthcare services, if the physician has a financial relationship with the entity.

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### DWC Issues Emergency Measures for Medical-Legal Evaluations During Governor Newsom's Stay-at-Home Order

State of California Department of Industrial Relations

**From April 6:** In line with Governor's Newsom's stay-at home order in response to the COVID-19 crisis issued on March 19, the Division of Workers' Compensation (DWC) encourages primary treating physicians to continue to manage injured workers' care through telehealth options whenever medically appropriate. Telehealth options include remote visits via video-conferencing, video-calling or similar such technology that allows each party to see each other via a video connection. These are viable alternatives to in-person physical examinations for medical-legal evaluations.

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### California Orders Insurance Premium Refunds Because of Change Caused By Coronavirus

**From April 20:** California's insurance commissioner recently ordered some companies to refund premiums for March and April because of the coronavirus, issuing a broad directive that includes payments made for workers compensation, medical malpractice and private and commercial auto policies.

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## State Compensation Insurance Fund — Forms a New WC Medical Provider Network

**From July 24:** Are you part of the State Fund Workers' Compensation Medical Provider Network? If Yes, read the below notice carefully. If No, but you would like to join the network, it's time to apply.

As of July 27, 2020, Harbor Health will no longer be managing the State Fund WC MPN. State Fund is bringing their network in-house. In late June, network physicians should have received a notice of this change. Injured workers have also been notified.

For a time during this transition, physicians currently in the network will be able to continue to treat their State Fund patients, but State Fund is indicating that not <u>all</u> current network physicians will be transitioned to the new network. Be on the look-out for a letter from State Fund around the end of July, letting you know whether you will be invited to be part of the new network. State Fund is required to have physicians sign new contracts. They have indicated that reimbursement levels will remain the same.

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If you are not currently part of the State Fund WC MPN, you can apply.
