Blue Shield Announces Contract Changes as of April 15, 2020

Blue Shield of California has announced upcoming changes to its physician fee schedule that will take effect on April 15, 2020. In a February 6 notice sent to physicians, the plan advised that it will be implementing fee schedule changes for durable medical equipment and clinical services.

Following the notice, COA received inquiries from our members about which services were included as "clinical





services." COA reached out to Blue Shield to obtain clarification and the plan shared with us that "clinical services" refers to clinical laboratory services billed by physicians. Blue Shield also clarified that there are no changes to reimbursement for professional services such as E/M codes, surgeries, procedures or pathology services.
