Kaiser Laying Off Hundreds of Healthcare Workers Across Northern CA

Kaiser Permanente is laying off hundreds of healthcare workers across Northern California. The layoffs will affect more than 200 healthcare workers at facilities all over Northern California, Union Press Secretary Renée Saldaña confirmed with KRON4. The workers impacted include admitting staff who are often the first line of interaction with patients, patient transport staff who help get patients to the right place for care in Walnut Creek and Antioch, and patient care technicians who provide bedside care in Oakland, among others.
